
ELDERS TREAT

After years of deferred maintenance, homes fall into disrepair and consequently fall into a downward spiral of code citations, loss of homeowner insurance and ultimately in mortgage foreclosure that impact not just individual homeowners, but entire neighborhoods. A Brush with Kindness helps homeowners avoid issues that can lead to losing their home.

A Brush with Kindness relies on churches, businesses and community organizations that contribute volunteers, finances and materials to effectively serve homeowners in need.

BACK IN HISTORY..... by Theresa Lund, Historian

From February 2007 St. Paul Messenger

In January, 1942, The St Paul congregation made application for membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio and Other States (Now LCMS).

March 24, 1942, the congregation resolved to request the District Mission Board to supply a resident pastor for Merced, and specified the Rev Edwin Fritze as it's choice. He was called by the Mission Board. Rev Fritze was ordained and installed on Cantate Sunday, May 3, 1942. Officiating was Rev George C Jacobsen of Stockton. The sermon was preached by Rev Arthur Brohm, Jr of Modesto. Others participating in the service were Rev R Spannous, Rev J F Bauermerate (spelling unclear) and Rev H J von Renner as well as laymen Ray Menssen, Eldo Sprecher and E J Pohli (Spelling unclear).

The congregation purchased a parsonage, through FHA, at 51 Union Ave in the Pastor's name, in July

Plans were drawn up for a church, but due to the war (WWII) and its restrictions, the idea was given up until more normal times. A building fund was established and invested in US Bonds.

Rev Fritze left Merced in August 1943 to accept a teaching position at a Lutheran High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Rev W B Struefert of Livingston served during the vacancy.
